


Tips Before You Meet with the School

Here are a few helpful tips before you meet with a school. If you have further questions, please reach out to Stone Soup Group to ask for more information or clarification. You are your child's best advocate, and you know them best!

Helpful tips:

- · MAKE SURE YOU MAKE ANY REQUEST IN WRITING AND SAVE A COPY (EMAIL IS FINE)
- · REVIEW MOST CURRENT INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM (IEP) AND EVALUATION SUMMARY + ELIGIBILITY REPORT (ESER) IF AVAILABLE, AND OUTSIDE EVALUATIONS OR ASSESSMENTS
- · WRITE DOWN THE QUESTIONS YOU HAVE. WHAT WORKS WELL AT HOME AND WHAT DOESN'T, AND GOALS YOU WOULD LIKE THE TEAM TO CONSIDER
- · ASK FOR DRAFT DOCUMENTS BEFORE THE MEETING FOR REVIEW
- · Bring your child's strengths, interests, and areas of concern
- · BRING SOMEONE, SUCH AS A FRIEND, FAMILY MEMBER, ADVOCATE, ETC.,
 TO TAKE NOTES AND AS ANOTHER SET OF EARS. NOTIFY THE SCHOOL
 WHO YOU ARE PLANNING ON BRINGING TO THE MEETING
- · REMEMBER: YOU ARE THE EXPERT ON YOUR CHILD, AND YOU ARE A VERY IMPORTANT MEMBER OF THE TEAM
